

Newly Certified Superintendent Demographics by Preparation Route 2017-18 through 2022-23

This report shows the number and percentage of candidates who received a standard superintendent certification through a Texas educator preparation program or who were issued a certification based on prior certification in a state other than Texas, aggregated by preparation route, gender, and race / ethnicity.

Definitions: An initial superintendent certificate is a standard superintendent certificate issued to an educator who was not previously issued a standard or lifetime superintendent certificate. Standard certificates, as defined in [19 TAC Chapter 230](#), are certificates offered since September 1, 1999 that are renewed every five years. The academic year is determined by the date of issuance. An academic year is defined as September 1 through August 31 of the following calendar year. Educators self-identify their gender and race / ethnicity in the Educator Certification Online System (ECOS). Educators may identify their gender as male or female. The race / ethnicity categories included in the table are mutually exclusive and educators can update their race / ethnicity specification at any time. In some instances, gender or race / ethnicity is not reported by the individual or local education agency.
