A student served through the GEH program at home or hospital bedside must be served by a certified general education teacher. Over the period of his or her confinement, the student must be provided instruction in all core academic subject area courses in which the student is enrolled. In addition, over the period of confinement, the student should be provided instruction in all other courses the student is enrolled in, if possible. In cases where students are medically able to receive more than the required minimum four hours of face to face instruction, LEAs must provide **additional remote instruction**. Please note, concurrent instruction is not allowed.

Requirements for General Education Homebound Instruction

Key requirements for homebound instruction are:

- The student is confined at home or hospital bedside for medical reasons only. Note: except in cases of medically fragile students, potential medical conditions or concerns that students may develop medical conditions do not constitute grounds for GEH program eligibility.
 - s documented by a physician licensed to practice
 - in the United States.

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- must also document that the student is expected to be confined at home or in a hospital bed for a minimum of four weeks. The weeks need not be consecutive.
- Students must receive four hours of face-to-face instruction on a weekly basis.
 - In cases where students are medically able to receive more than the required minimum four hours of face to face instruction, LEAs must provide additional remote instruction. Please note, concurrent instruction is not allowed.

General Education Homebound Audit and Reporting
